A 75-year-old today is expected to have as many years left to live as a 65-year-old did in 1950, meaning once we reach retirement age, we could still have decades of meaningful life ahead of us. It is time to think of later life as a time for new opportunities rather than decline.

Tackling a rapidly ageing population, social innovators across Asia have been developing solutions to better support elder people in working, playing, and living. Join the conversation at SIRF 2021 to explore the role of social innovation and participatory design in the making of age-friendly communities, and identify ways forward for the future of ageing with leading experts.

The Hong Kong Jockey Club is dedicated to supporting our society in addressing social challenges and needs through innovative and collaborative approaches.

In this regard, the Club's Charities Trust is pleased to have supported the PolyU Jockey Club "Operation Solnno" programme since 2018. Through cross-sectoral collaboration involving academia, non-governmental organisations, professional bodies and community stakeholders, the initiative has been working to improve the quality of life for our citizens by coming up with innovative and practical solutions to tackle increasingly complex social issues.

Encouragingly, the programme's outcomes have exceeded expectations. Over the past three years, it has been coordinating 16 action projects and generated 35 practical design and protypes while convening a series of participatory symposia and workshops for more than 9,300 attendances. Seventeen secondary schools have been empowered to adopt a curriculum that integrates social innovation and design thinking to nurture young social innovators. More than 1,300 delegates from 16 countries/regions participated in last year's Social Innovation Regional Forum.

To my delight, the programme is embarking on a new milestone with the launch of its second phase this year. It will further develop sustainable, multidisciplinary prototyped solutions, strengthen the training support for teachers, as well as promote pedagogical innovation and seamless knowledge dissemination, both online and offline. All these seek to support more underprivileged people and help our younger generations develop 21st century skills.


香港賽馬會一直積極鼓勵透過創新思維及多 方協作,應對社會種種挑戰及不同需要。

With members appointed by the President of PolyU from different sectors of society, the JCDISI Advisory Committee aims at providing inspirational advice on academic and professional development directions to JCDISI. One of the foci is to steer JCDISI's effort towards meeting community needs and fostering wider collaboration among community stakeholders, enabling JCDISI to proliferate their work more effectively to a diversified spectrum of society, spanning across urban and humanity problems, social innovation, social entrepreneurship, social welfare and services, arts, design and culture.

In the past two years, JCDISI focused its effort on tackling "Double Ageing", which refers to the combined impact of population and building stock ageing. This year, JCDISI has extended its focus to "Age-friendly Communities", seeking to explore, from a social innovation perspective, the essentials of creating an inclusive environment for all ages, including improvement of software such as services, community relations, and business models; and hardware such as housing and public space design. Examples of our accomplishments in the area are the "One from Hundred Thousand" symposium series' Season 8 programme "Silver Age Startups", through which we encouraged senior citizens to start their socially beneficial projects, thereby creating and redefining the value system of working seniors and the perception of

JCDISI在過去兩年聚焦於「雙老化」議題——即指建築物老化和人口老化,今年將視野再拉闊至年齡友善社區,鼓勵社會各界別的人士帶著「社會創新」的目光與視野,共同改善構成社區的「軟件」,例如服務、社區關係、營運模式;軟件」,例如房屋與公共空間的建設,或者「硬件」,例如房屋與公共空間的建設,使各方面配合所有年齡層人士的需要,建構共融環境。JCDISI之前舉行的「十萬分一」社創研討會第八季項目「銀齡創業」,鼓勵長者創立自己社會的事業,創新長者工作的價值,翻轉「老齡化」的觀念;又如第十一季項目「長者友善社區規劃」,綜合過百位長者的意見而訂立的「長者友善社區評核指標」,讓長者評核家居、商場、道路是否年齡友善,JCDISI則提出改善方案,以提升他們的生活質素。

Welcome to the Social Innovation Regional Forum (SIRF) 2021 of the PolyU Jockey Club "Operation Solnno".

Continuing into its third year, SIRF explores the intersection between ageing issues and social innovation, highlighting the potential of the latter to change the way we think about and experience ageing.

In previous years, SIRF focused on the phenomenon of "Double Ageing", namely the simultaneous process of population and building stock ageing, a difficult challenge with compounding effects that are increasingly faced around the world. This year, we shift our focus to examine the making of age-friendly communities.

With rising life expectancy, we find ourselves living a much longer "later life". But social norms and expectations in society have yet to catch up, with many aspects of life, such as transport and mobility, employment, leisure, continuous learning, social and community support, are not sufficiently enabling people of all ages in leading fruitful lives. Social innovators from across Asia, the most rapidly ageing part of the world, have been developing solutions to better enable older people to work, play, and live. SIRF 2021 brings together these experts and practitioners to explore the role of social innovation and participatory design in the making of age-friendly communities.


SIRF is the flagship knowledge exchange event under the PolyU JC "Operation Solnno" project funded by the Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust and run by the Jockey Club Design Institute for Social Innovation (JCDISI). Keen to bring the conversation on age-friendliness from the university campus into the community, SIRF 2021 kicked off with an age-friendly carnival and a design thinking workshop, welcoming members of the public at the revitalised heritage buildings 7 Mallory Street and Central Market respectively. A subsequent session


Biography 個人簡介

Dr Law Chi-kwong was appointed as the Secretary for Labour and Welfare on 1 July 2017.

Between 1981 and 2017, Dr Law taught in the Department of Social Work (later renamed Department of Social Work and Social Administration) of the University of Hong Kong. He was the Head of the Department from 1993 to 1997 and was associate professor before he joined the Government. Dr Law was a Member of the Legislative Council from 1995 to 1997 and from 1998 to 2004. He also held a number of public offices, including Chairman of the Community Care Fund Task Force, member of the Commission on Poverty, member of the Commission on Strategic Development and member of the Statistics Advisory Board.

Lauren has a background in experience design and design research and has been supporting social innovation and systems change work with TACSI for the last 3 years.

Topic: Building an Impact Network for Systemic Change in End of Life 題目:建立「影響網絡」實現寧養體制改革

Our research showed that people are missing essential 'death literacy' about the choices available to them, and that there's a disconnect between key stages in the end of life journey that affect good outcomes.

Our chosen approach was to seed an Impact Network. Networks and systems have a similar ability to adapt and change to their given context; both respond to input in emergent and often surprising and unplanned ways over time. We believe that a moving system needs a moving ecosystem for response and transformation.

我們的研究指出,大眾缺乏有關寧養的基本認知,對於各種方案並不了解。寧養過程中不同 重要階段亦因此欠缺連貫性,影響最終結果。

為應對上述問題,我們選擇建立一個「影響網絡」。網絡和體制均能隨着實況而應變,兩者會因應參與者的貢獻而逐漸以出奇不已和計劃之外的方式演變。我們相信,一個不斷演變的體制,背後總需要一個不斷演變的生態系統以作出回應和推動改革。

Xu Yongguang is the Honorary President of the Narada Foundation, Guest Researcher of Counselor Office of the State Council and a member of the Advisory Board of the UNDP SDG Financing Platform. He was a member of the Ninth and Tenth National Committees of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference (CPPCC).

Mr. Xu founded the China Youth Development Foundation after he resigned from head of the Organization Department under the Central Committee of the China Communist Youth League in 1988. The Project Hope founded by him has been developed and recognized as the most influential philanthropic brand in China. In 2007, he co-founded the Narada Foundation with a mission to foster civil society and promote the development and social innovation of the philanthropy sector.

Mr. Xu is a renowned thinker and practitioner with over 30 years' experience in philanthropy and non-profit sector. He has made tremendous contribution to the theoretical and practical research on NGO development, social enterprises and impact investing. He is the Chief Editor of China's Third Sector Study Series and the author of Inquiry of the world—Project Hope in Xu Yongguang's eyes and Social Enterprises, and Where Philanthropy Meets Business.

Topic: Resolving Pain Points in Elderly Service through Social Enterprise 題目: 社會企業為老齡服務解痛點

According to the latest national census, the population of China has aged more rapidly yet again. In the face of challenges and opportunities, the China government and members of society at large have begun innovative explorations. In the Government's fourteenth Five-Year Plan, "proactively tackling population ageing" was written into the country's development strategy, with age-friendly community building being implemented across the country in 2021. In the past decade, Chinese society began to explore the tackling of social issues through social enterprises. In relation to the topic of age-friendliness, what attempts have there been in Chinese social entrepreneurship and how well are they developing? In a post-pandemic world, what areas and directions of development are there for social enterprises to tackle an ageing population? All this will be shared in today's discussion.

Operating at the cutting edge of R&D, lan also serves as a Monitoring Officer for Innovate UK, the government's innovation agency, where he has worked with numerous highly innovative companies developing game-changing solutions, invariably resulting in successful commercialisation, significant return on investment and positive impact on the UK's economy.

Topic: Cultivating Neighbourhoods that Care

題目:培養懂得照顧的鄰里

With mounting evidence indicating that multigenerational interaction is beneficial for people of all ages, AAA has joined forces with the International Organization for Standardization ISO, to convene a gold standard for smart multigenerational neighbourhoods. Rather than allowing segregation and risk potential ghettoisation, this presentation marks the launch of a new report which makes the case for integration and harmonisation of our neighbourhoods by foreseeing, adapting and accommodating to our needs as we journey through life. In pooling research, expertise and insights, stakeholders have the opportunity to revolutionise the design of our neighbourhoods of the future, at both the micro and macro levels.

Dr. Norah Wang's research focuses on social innovation and governance, particularly institutional developments that enable collaborative governance, commons and rural and urban regeneration and social entrepreneurial ecosystems. Norah has had interdisciplinary research training in organizational studies, psychology and behavioral economics, political science and public administration. She was a research assistant professor at the PolyU Department of Applied Social Sciences and did two Post-docs at the HKU Department of Social Work and Social Administration and Department of Politics and Public Administration. While she was the senior project manager of the HKU-HKJC ExCEL3 Project, she worked closely with the Hong Kong Council of Social Service and built a CEO competency model and NGO capacity building framework for social services NGOs. Her research on social service contracting was also funded by the Public Policy Research Funding Scheme of the Policy Innovation and Co-ordination Office of the Government of Hong Kong SAR. As a veteran social impact analyst, Norah founded IMPACT ANLATICS (IA), a social enterprise, with a view to addressing the impact-management bottleneck facing social sectors.

Topic: Social Innovation and Social Governance in China 題目: 中國的社會創新及社會管治

The objective of this study is to examine social innovation in Chinese contexts. Many governments are taking actions to encourage social innovation in civil society to meet mounting societal needs. However, in non-democratic contexts, the need to reduce political uncertainty is an important factor that affects governments' institutional choice. Drawing on the literatures of politics of structural choice and metagovernance, we analyze the institutional developments for social service provision in two Chinese cities—Shenzhen and Guangzhou.

We find that in mainland China, both social service provision and production have become more decentralized through experiments on local governance under the policy directive of social construction and social governance. The analysis shows the ambition of meta-governors to address social needs, maintain social stability and ensure political control over the third sector through professionalization, the use of co-opted intermediaries for the incubation of social organizations and orchestration of service provision for local communities.

本研究旨在探討中國特色的社會創新。為應對日益增加的社會需求,很多國家的政府鼓勵公民社會參與社會創新,而降低政治不確定因素則是非民主政府推行制度性決策時的重要考量。我們參考有關組織決策與「元治理」(又稱「後設管治」)的政治學文獻,分析兩個中國城市一深圳和廣州一的社會服務的制度性發展。

我們發現,在中國大陸社會建設和社會管治的政策方向下,地方性的管治實驗令社會服務的提供和實踐變得去中心化。分析顯示元政府藉著中介機構培育社會組織,為當地社區協調服務,務求達到處理社會需求、維持社會穩定、以及透過專業化管控第三界別的分而治之的效果。

Quyen has more than 30 years' experience working in research, emergency response and community development in Asia. His roles in the region and globally is to provide technical support in areas relating to age-friendly livelihood, disaster response and preparedness, healthy and active ageing, community base-care, age-friendly cities and communities, policy advocacy and in the establishment and capacity building of Older People Associations (OPA). Since 2003, he and his team has been working with country offices and network members to developed and expanded OPAs that follow the community driven development (CDD) approach, which are community-led, multifunctional, cost-effective, affordable, sustainable, and replicable in low resource communities throughout the Asia and Pacific region. By the end of 2020, millions of OPAs with hundreds of millions of members have been established and continue to expand rapidly in the region. Looking beyond Asia, the OPA model has being successfully piloted in Africa and the Middle East.

Since 2015, he has conducted annual regional OPA (TOT) training courses for development practitioners and policy makers in the region and beyond. With respect to COVID-19, he has also supported OPAs in Asia to develop intervention to reduce the impact of COVID-19 on older people and others at-risk group.

Mary Ann Tsao is the Chairperson and Founding Director of the Tsao Foundation, a Singapore-based - but regionally oriented - non-profit operational foundation dedicated to aged care and ageing issues. Previously, she was also its CEO and President. Tsao Foundation aims to address issues of population ageing, promote successful ageing and enhance wellbeing of older people at policy and practice levels by catalysing constructive change.

Dr Tsao serves on numerous boards and committees of government and non-profit organisations in Singapore as well as internationally. For her work on ageing, she received the Public Service Medal (PBM) in 2000, Public Service Star (BBM) in 2004, and Public Service Star (Bar) in 2015 from the government of Singapore.

Dr Tsao has also worked with numerous multilateral agencies, such as WHO Geneva office's Ageing and Life Course unit, and has been a resource person and technical advisor to other UN agencies, such as UNESCAP (United Nations Economic and Social Commission for the Asia Pacific) and the ASEAN Secretariat. She is currently the Co-President of ILC-Global Alliance as well.

A member of a business family, Dr Tsao was also involved with Family Business Network Asia (FBNA) as a Board Director – she completed her term of service in 2020. Today, Dr Tsao remains a member of its Ambassador Circle and continues to advocate for family businesses to put purpose in profit and be a force for good. She is also involved in various other family businesses and non-profit projects.

Born and raised in Hong Kong, Dr Tsao is a US trained physician with a public health background, specialising in community and primary care planning and social medicine. She has extensive experience working with disadvantaged communities in the US and Singapore.

The first event of the Social Innovation Regional Forum (SIRF) 2021, The Future of Getting Old(er) Carnival, was successfully held at 7 Mallory Street on 16th October. Consisted of online and offline interactive activities and an exhibition, the Carnival welcomed the public in experiencing age-friendly communities, and encouraged everyone to become social innovators. Over 700 guests in Hong Kong and Mainland China participated through in-person visits, Facebook broadcast and a live virtual tour for participants in the Mainland.

In his welcome remark, **Dr Calvin Luk, Acting Director of the Jockey Club Design Institute for Social Innovation (JCDISI)**, introduced the meaning and social significance of the theme of the Forum – "The Making of Age-friendly Communities in Rapidly Ageing Societies". He raised the notion of stepping out of academia and into the community, where stakeholders of different ages and sectors can all play a role in shaping age-friendly communities through social innovation.

社會創新區域論壇2021的首場活動「重『創新』 定義老」嘉年華在10月16日於香港茂蘿街7號成 功舉辦。活動以線上線下互動活動及展覽的形 式,讓大眾體驗年齡友善社區,鼓勵人人都可以 成為社會創新者。透過現場參與、Facebook直播 和內地「雲導賞」,吸引香港及內地超過700人 參與。

理大賽馬會社會創新設計院(JCDISI)署理總監 陸永康博士在歡迎致辭中重點向大家介紹了論壇 主題「共創年齡友善社區」的內涵和社會意義: 「走出大學,進入社區」,不同年齡及界別的持 份者都能出一分力,透過社會創新的方法營造年 齡友善社區。

香港理工大學活齡學院副項目員(團隊主管)李 麗芬女士則分享了他們開展的研究、教育和實 踐,幫助長者實現夢想,並強調將跨學科知識成 果落地轉化為社區實踐的重要性。

The Future of Getting Old(er) Age-friendly Carnival

重「創新」定義老 年齡友善嘉年華

Project Associate (Team Lead) of the Hong Kong PolyU Institute of Active Ageing, Ms Anita Lee, shared about their research, teaching and projects which have helped older people in realising their dreams. She stressed the importance of applying cross-discipline academic knowledge in community outreach efforts.

In the interactive session, social innovators supported by the Good Seed entrepreneurship funding programme and PolyU Jockey Club "Operation Solnno" Silver Age Startup programme shared about their projects. They invited older participants to experience their innovations on stage, attracting many passers-by to stop and observe.

NeuroGym is a gamified training platform for older people and recovering individuals, developed by **Medmind Technology Limited** and supported by Good Seed. It is equipped with data analytics and user monitoring functions, and aims to reduce the chance of dementia. The demonstrated game was a smart Mahjong game which allowed young and old to play together. When playing against the older opponents, young people wore reading glasses and weighted sandbags on their wrists, allowing them to physically experience common body conditions faced by the elderly. **Founder Mr Nathan Hui** said that smart Mahjong helps older people to learn new technologies, and offers a new experience for intergenerational interactions.

DanzUp, a programme that was awarded seed grant in the Silver Age Startup programme, suggests using dance training to prevent falling among older people, reducing risks posed to their bodies. To the tune of the Cantonese pop song, their dance coach led the old and the young, including children, in dancing simple moves, celebrating energetic collaboration between the 50+ and the youth. Founder of DanzUp, John State, is a 50+ silver age social entrepreneur. When he fell ill for three years following his retirement when he turned 55, John started to plan out how he could live his life more meaningfully in the next 30 years. He returned to school to study gerontology where he gained an understanding of overseas fall prevention concepts, ultimately leading him to establish DanzUp to help older people stay physically and mentally healthy.

互動環節邀請來自好薈社及理大賽馬會社創「 騷·In·廬」銀齡社創項目培育的社創家們分享,並即時邀請長者上台體驗,更吸引不少路過的大眾駐足圍觀。

好薈社支持的「腦有記」是由醫念科技有限公司研發,專為長者和復康人士而設的遊戲訓練平台,能分析數據、監察用家認知能力,和預防腦退化。分享環節中的示範遊戲是一個能讓長者及年輕人合作參與的智能麻雀競技。當中年輕人戴上老花鏡和負重手腕沙包,體驗老年的身體狀態,與長者鬥一番。創辦人許天浩先生(Nathan)表示,智能麻雀既能幫助長者學習新科技,也能提供一個跨代互動的新體驗。

獲得「理大賽馬會社創『騷·In·廬』」「銀齡社創」起動基金的DanzUp則提出利用舞蹈訓練,防止年長人士跌倒,減少對他們身體的影響。當日教練與長者、年輕人、小朋友一同跳「花花世界」,短短數分鐘已完成簡單的舞蹈,展示50+與年輕人緊密合作,發揮活力的一面。DanzUp的創始人John State是一位50+銀齡社創家,55歲退休後患病三年,開始重新思考如何規劃接下來30年的生活,讓晚年過得更有價值和意義,於是他重回校園修讀老年學課程,並吸納外國防跌理念,創辦DanzUp,讓長者保持身心健康。

好薈社支持的軟膳點致力於改善吞咽困難人士的生活條件,提供一站式精緻軟餐及吞咽困難相關產品。軟膳點邀請了長者上台製作咕嚕肉軟餐,了解制作食材的比例、安全指引和製作技巧。創辦人羅卓賢先生(Jackson)指,當初是為了幫助家中有吞咽困難的長輩,發現市場上訂不到合適吞咽困難人士的餐點,才開始自行研發軟餐。目前軟膳點開設了網店,為全港長者及有需要人士供應豐富的精緻軟餐,希望能夠幫助他們提升生活品質。

獲得「理大賽馬會社創『騷·In·廬』」「銀

Good Seed-supported venture Mealingful aims to improve the lives of people experiencing dysphagia, or difficulty in swallowing, and provides a one-stop service for soft meals and related products. Mealingful invited older people to help make sweet and sour pork on stage, teaching everyone the correct ratios, safety precautions, and preparation techniques for creating soft meals. Founder Mr Jackson Law shared how trying to assist an elderly relative who experienced dysphagia made him realise the difficulty in ordering suitable food for these individuals on the market. This led him to begin developing soft meals himself. Mealingful now has an online shop, providing intricate soft meals for older people and others in need, with the hopes of improving their quality of life.

Another team who was awarded seed grant in the Silver Age Startup project was MassageXercise Pain Relief, who advocate treating aches effectively through a combination of Tui Na massage and sports. Founder Andy So shared his attitude towards embracing post-retirement work and continued education. He invited older people to experience Tui Na on stage, and provided guidance on everyday training and exercise.

An interactive exhibition also took place offstage, showcasing projects including innovative design solutions for addressing difficulties faced by tenants subdivided units, voice-activated interactive robot Tung Zai, a recycling trolley redesigned for use by elderly wastepickers, models and videos of the Kowloon Park fitness trail and intergenerational therapeutic garden, and a matching game that teaches the relationship between social innovation and technology.

台下亦設有多個互動展覽,展示項目包括劏房租 戶面對的困難與創新設計方案、語音互動機械人 「東仔」小幫手、試推專為拾荒長者改良設計的 回收手推車、九龍健身徑和跨代共融療愈花園的 模型及短片,以及引導社會認識社會創新與科技 的配對遊戲。

Design Thinking Workshop by Design Education Team, JCDISI 由賽馬會社會創新設計院啟迪創新習作團隊帶領 Retire [退休] Details 詳情 Replay 網上重播 The second event of the Social Innovation Regional Forum (SIRF) 2021 continued the event's commitment to step out of academia and into the community, taking the form of a workshop titled Design Thinking for Age-friendly Communities held at Central Market. Participatory design cases were first shared by several speakers, before in-person and online participants took part in a co-creation experience workshop. Silver-age influencers May, Carrie and Sasa from the Senior Citizen Home Safety Association were emcees for the event, embodying the theme of the day.

An ideal community is not only designed for people of all ages, but of different disabilities as well. Mr Bryan Lai, Centre Supervisor of The Neighbourhood Advice-Action Council, shared how he and his team realised their residents' dream "trip to Finland". Decorating the residence as an airline cabin, residents were able to experience being on a flight and even enjoyed "in-flight meals", an experience that has gained critical acclaim from across society. Bryan noted several factors that led to the success of the event, including stepping outside the box to think from the perspective of the service user, encouraging stakeholder participation, and making good use of social media.

Ms Debby Cheng, Project Manager at the Jockey Club Design Institute for Social Innovation (JCDISI) of the Hong Kong Polytechnic University, shared the achievements of two of the Institute's innovative projects, namely a voice-activated interactive robot called Tung Zai and a waste recycling trolley co-designed with elderly grassroots wastepickers and an socially inclusive waste management hub. She emphasized having to consider the needs of older adults from different socioeconomic backgrounds when realising age-friendly communities in order to incorporate care and design beliefs.

Ms Keilee Mok, Senior Manager, Community Engagement at the CUHK Medical Centre, shared about the incorporation of feedback from patients, carers, and staff into the Centre's mode and process of care. The physical environment at the Centre, including the adoption of warm lighting and colourful comfortable bathrooms, were also shared, attracting admiring gazes from the audience. Keilee further emphasised the connection between design thinking and hospital service, noting the design workshop found within the Centre. This serves as a space for different voices in the community to be heard, ultimately working hand-in-hand with community members to create a better hospital care experience.

To encourage participants in trying design thinking, a workshop then followed. While the offline activities were led by Mr Albert Tsang, facilitator from the JCDISI Design Education team, the online component was guided by PolyU School of Design Associate Professor Prof. Brian Lee and silver-age influencers Carrie and Sasa. The icebreaking game revealed that "old" is no longer defined by numbers; many people aged 50+ today remain very independent and capable. The hosts then encouraged participants to use keyword cards to brainstorm ideas for learning and post-retirement life when they themselves get older. Many interesting examples were shared including having children teach adults associative thinking, establishing an oral history archive, and silver-age matchmaking.

社會創新區域論壇2021的第二場活動繼續「走出大學,進入社區」,在中環街市舉辦工作坊:以設計思維締造年齡友善社區。本次專題研討先由幾位講者分享參與式設計實際案例,隨後線上線下的參加者參與共創體驗工作坊。更請來長者安居協會的銀齡KOL,May、Carrie及Sasa作主持,貫徹「共創年齡友善社區」的主題。

一個理想的社區不單為所有年齡層而設,更可以為 殘障人士為設。鄰舍輔導會中心主任黎志恒先生 (Bryan)分享了他和團隊以人為本的角度,在疫情期 間中心為其院舍服務的院友實現「芬蘭之旅」的夢 想。他們佈置整個院舍成機艙,院友能體驗乘搭飛 機、享用飛機餐等等,活動獲得了各方好評。Bryan指,要有突破傳統框框的思維、從服務使用者的 角度出發、鼓勵持份者的參與、善用社交媒體等是 活動成功的關鍵。

理大賽馬會社會創新設計院社會項目經理鄭依依女

士(Debby),以語音互動機械人東仔及為基層年長工 友設計的回收手推車,以及社區共融廢物處理中心 為案例,與大家分享JCDISI創新項目的成果,強調 在營造年齡友善社區時,須考慮到不同社會及經濟 背景的長者需要,將無微不至的關懷和設計理念融 入當中。

來自香港中文大學醫院社區聯繫高級經理的莫姬莉女士(Keilee),則分享了其團隊在設計醫院時,虛心接受病人、照顧者和護理人員的寶貴意見,並仔細地考慮到照顧模式過程的需要。在分享中還展示了中大醫院裡病房的真實環境,例如採用暖色燈光、色彩舒適的浴室,吸引現場及線上觀眾的青睞和迴響。此外,Keilee強調將設計思維與醫院服務聯繫,在醫院內設立設計工作室,以便傾聽社區各界的意見,與社區攜手共創更優質的醫護體驗。

為了鼓勵參加者實踐設計思維,第二部分隨即進行工作坊,線下由賽馬會社會創新設計院啟迪創新習作導師曾兆賢先生(Albert)帶領,而線上則由理工大學設計學院副教授李宇軒博士(Brian)及兩位銀齡KOLCarrie及SaSa與觀眾互動。在破冰遊戲中,參加者發現原來「老」的定義已不是由數字限制,今天很多50歲或以上人士,依然非常獨立、自主、有能力。主持更鼓勵各位利用關鍵詞卡重新想像自己在老年時學習、退休生活的新點子。當中有不少的有趣的例子,例如「細路仔教大人聯想思維」、「口述歷史資料庫」、「樂齡配對」等等。



Cross-sector Innovations in Age-friendly Communities

Thematic Session 3 (Mainland) was held in Shenzhen in the morning on 19 November, beginning with welcome remarks given by Acting Director of JCDISI, Dr Calvin Luk, and CEO of PolyU Shenzhen Research Institute (SZRI), Ms Maggie Chen. Dr Luk shared JCDISI's goal and progress in establishing a social innovation network in the Greater Bay Area, while Ms Chen introduced the work of the SZRI and age-friendliness related alumni enterprises supported by SZRI. JCDISI representative in Shenzhen Ms Nie Yang then shared the latest developments and result on a social innovation study conducted by PolyU.

Ms Shiyu Lu, Research Fellow at Tencent Research Institute, discussed her latest research through the lens of ageing and technology. She discovered that most of the world's most agefriendly communities are not digitally integrated, and believes

騰訊研究院的高級研究員陸詩雨女士從科技適老 的角度介紹她最新研究。她發現,目前全球最優 秀的適老社區,大多都不是採用數碼方法來建 造。她認為,中國急促發展的科技產品與服務, that the rapid development of tech products and services in China could help realise age-friendly communities in the country. Ms Lu offered three key questions to the audience to think about the value of incorporating digital technologies in ageing: how do we enhance the value of intergenerational connections? How do we help sustain a sense of community? How do we normalize age-friendly experiences across the country?

Dr Wei Xijun, CEO of the PolyU alumni enterprise Avatar Rehab, discussed rehabilitation challenges faced by elderlies who have fallen ill, and shared about an innovative VR solution. Dr Wei noted that nervous system diseases such as Parkinson's disease are trickiest to handle among older people while patients also face expensive rehabilitation services and monotonous training regimes. Dr Wei and his team employed VR technology to situate older people in virtual settings, allowing them to return to their community, increasing the fun of rehabilitation while lowering its cost.

Speaking from a social service approach, General Dirctor of Shanghai Jinmei Elderly Care Center Mr Fei Chao shared their experience in establishing a community support centre for families of people with dementia, in the hope of realising an age- and dementia-friendly community. To this end, Jinmei concentrates their efforts on four aspects – the prevention of dementia, screening assessment, family support and support network. They provide services using innovative methods and commercialized and standardized approaches.

Coming from an urban community placemaking angle, Ms Zhou Yue, Urban Governance Researcher at UrbanXYZ Technology Co., Ltd., shared about age-friendly and inclusive community design. She shared a few methodologies used by different organisations, and introduced investigation methods such as playing 'space detective', daily journals, and telephone hotlines to understand the routines, behavioural preferences and everyday interactions of residents of different ages and genders. These ways of sensing and understanding behavior reveal residents' needs and expectations from the space.

In the concluding panel discussion, moderator Ms Caitlyn Huang, Secretary General of the Shenzhen Aging Development foundation, shared her belief that digital technology will be widely applied to elderly services, but noted that there is much room for growth for digital age-friendly communities, and for more sustainable applications of digital technologies in ageing-related technology. The guests continued their discussion on the theme, before Dr Luk expressed his hope and anticipation to undertake cross-discipline, cross-region collaborative work with the session's guests.

能有助國內營造適老社區。陸女士提出了三個關鍵問題,讓大眾思考未來數碼技術對適老化的價值:如何使代際連接更有價值?如何幫助維繫社區理念可持續?如何使適老經驗在全國普及?

香港理工大學校友企業阿凡達康復科技CEO危昔 均博士,則從專業醫學康復的角度來介紹老年人 患病後面對的康復難題,並分享創新的VR解決 方案。危博士指出長者的神經系統疾病是最棘 手,如帕金遜症。患者在康復後須面臨昂貴成本 的復康服務、枯燥單調的康復訓練等問題。危博 士及團隊應用VR虛擬科技幫助長者搭建虛擬場 景,讓他們能夠回歸社區、增加康復訓練的趣味 性,還能減低成本。

上海盡美長者服務中心總幹事費超先生從社區服務的角度,分享了他們為營造老年認知障礙友好社區,而成立社區認知障礙家庭支持中心的前線經驗。盡美從預防認知障礙症、篩查評估、家庭支援以及支援網路四大方面開展工作,並運用創新的手法、商品化及標準化的方式進行服務。

城市象限科技有限公司的城市治理研究員周悦女

士,從城市社區空間營造的角度,進行全齡包容性社區設計。她介紹幾個機構常用的方法學,更介紹了利用「空間偵探」、「生活日誌」、熱線電話等調查方法,從而感受社區不同年齡及性別的居民群體活動習慣、行為偏好、鄰里互動特點等,通過行為習慣的感知總結出社區居民對空間建設的需求。

最後討論環節,由深圳市老齡事業發展基金會秘 書長黃晨樂女士擔任主持人,她認為數碼技術將 會廣泛應用於長者服務,但目前國內的數碼適老 社區發展仍有頗大的提升空間,數碼技術應用在 適老技術上的持續性亦不足夠。幾位嘉賓繼續為 主題討論,最後陸博士展望及期待與各位專家進 行跨學科、跨區的聯合工作。

Innovating for System Change in Age-friendly Communities

從制度創新改革:營造年齡友善社區

Thematic Session 3 (Regional) was held in the afternoon on 19 November in Hong Kong. Social innovators from Taiwan, Vietnam, Hong Kong, and Australia were invited to share case studies and discuss a path towards system change from the bottom up that would encourage participation from the public and the government to create age-friendly communities.

Ms Yi Ying Lin, Chairman of the Board at Plahan Symbiosis Care Labor Cooperative in Taiwan, shared her efforts in promoting and nurturing community-based carers for older bedridden individuals. Established by Yi Ying, every carer in the Plahan coop is also an owner. In just two years, the coop attracted more and more young people in joining, earning a profit of more than NT\$1.6 million. Improving carers' financial situation and at the same time providing bedridden individuals with professional, long term care, this win-win outcome of the coop model received numerous prizes and recognition from different

專題研討三(區域)於11月19日下午於香港舉行,邀請了台灣、越南、香港及澳洲的創新者分享實例,探討如何由下而上創新制度,鼓勵大眾及政府共同參與,營造年齡友善社區。

有限責任台灣伯拉罕共生照顧勞動合作社理事主席林依瑩女士,分享了她推動及培育當地專門服務高齡臥床者的長期照服員(即是香港的護理員) 紮根原鄉的實例。林女士成立伯拉罕勞動合作社,每一位照服員都會成為合作社的老闆。短短兩年間,成功吸引到愈來愈多年輕人加入,並獲得營利160多萬新台幣。照服員的經濟條件得到了改善、臥床者同樣得到了專業的長期照護,合作社這種雙贏的經驗也得到了多項大獎及社會各界的認可。她認為這種共生照顧勞動合作社的模式值得長期發展,能成功彌補當地照服員依賴外勞的問題。

sectors across society. Yi Ying believes that there is value in developing this model long-term in order to compensate for the reliance on foreign labour in local care.

Country Director for HelpAge International in Vietnam, Ms Thuy Bich Tran introduced the Intergenerational Self-help Club (ISHC) model self-managed by elderlies themselves. ISHCs are organisations made up of around 70 older adults, with 3,500 clubs already established across Vietnam. Thuy introduced eight characteristics of the ISHCs that foster mutual care and support, including providing social and cultural activities, sustainable income security, health care, community-based care, self-help network development, life-long learning, rights and entitlement advocacy, and resource mobilisation. Currently the ISHC model is incorporated into Vietnam's national policy, and is recognised by numerous awards.

Project Manager II / Spatial at JCDISI, Ms Karen Lee, shared the Institute's exploration into intergenerational play space design and management. Since 2019, JCDISI has held a series of workshops and events that encourage the public in reimagining parks and public spaces through an intergenerational approach, attracting participation by different stakeholders and combining PolyU's cross-discipline knowledge with design thinking. Discussing JCDISI's strategies, Karen drew from cases including the intergeneration therapeutic garden at Lai Kok Estate, the Prosperous Garden intergenerational play space design competition, and an intergenerational re-design of the Kowloon Park Fitness Trail.

Mr Brugh O'Brien, Principal: Future of Home at The Australian Centre for Social Innovation (TACSI), discussed collaborative approaches that allow governments and designers to develop better healthcare infrastructures, bettering the lives of patients and their families. He drew from the design of the Neurobehavioural Unit at the Repat Health Precint in Adelaide as a case study. Violent behaviour among older people is common in South Australia, and are often caused by dementia and other neurological disorders. In order to provide professional care and treatment to individuals with dementia and serious mental health issues, the Government of South Australia initiated the development of the Neurobehavioural unit. Brugh illustrated the co-design process, and noted the emphasis on family members' experiences while including direct participation from policymakers, architects, and consumer rights advocates.

Acting Director of JCDISI Dr Calvin Luk moderated the panel discussion towards the end. He noted how the fragmented nature of relevant existing policies fail to encourage older adults who are set in their ways to adopt newer practices. He suggested instead that encouraging young people to participate and experience helping older people is the best approach to realising age-friendly communities.

國際助老會越南國家主任Thuy Bich TRAN女士介紹以長者自主管理的跨代自助俱樂部(ISHC)的模式。ISHC是由約70位老年人組成的跨代自助組織,目前越南全國已經有3500多個ISHC。Thuy Bich TRAN女士介紹了俱樂部八個特點,其中重點介紹ISHC能提供多元互助的功能,例如提供社會文化活動、可持續收入保障、健康照顧體檢、社區護理、自助網絡發展、終身學習、爭取權利和服務意識、動員不同資源。目前ISHC的模式已成為越南國家政策,更獲得很多獎項。

香港理工大學賽馬會社會創新設計院(JCDISI)空間項目經理II李雅筠女士(Karen),則分享JCDISI在探索跨代共融遊樂空間設計和管理的案例。在2019年以來JCDISI舉辦一系列的工作坊及活動,鼓勵大眾從跨代共融的角度重塑公園及公共空間,當中涉及不同持份者的參與、結合理大跨學科專業知識、以及設計思維。Karen結合JCDISI項目如麗閣邨跨代共融療愈花園、駿發花園跨代共融遊樂空間設計比賽、以及九龍健身徑跨代共融設計,講解了JCDISI的行動策略。

來自澳洲社會創新中心首席未來家居專家Brugh O'BRIEN先生介紹了如何透過協作設計方式,讓政府和設計師建立醫護架構,為病人及其家人帶來更好的生活,並以阿德萊德Repat健康中心(Repat Health Precint)的神經行為部門(Neurobehavioural Unit,NBU)作為案例。南澳經常存在長者暴力行為,而這些暴力行為往往是老人的認知障礙症或神經問題導致。為了幫助這些患有認知障礙行為及精神病症的極端人士提供專業照顧及治療,政府主導成立了神經行為部門。Brugh介紹整個輔導設計過程,他們著重患有認知障礙人士家人的親身經驗,當中亦有政策制定者、建築師和消費者權益倡議者等直接參與。

在最後討論環節,**理工大學賽馬會社會創新設計院 署理總監陸永康博士**擔任主持。他指出,目前政策 太零碎、改變舊派長者接受新事物是最困難,他因 此鼓勵年輕人多參與,感受幫助老人帶來的收穫, 共創年齡友善社區的最佳途徑。
